Pohaikalani Kirkland (Right) of the Hawaiian Monk Seal Recovery Project talks about the cultural significance of the Monk Seal to the Hawaiian people. Michele Bane represents the NOAA Marine Mammal Health and Stranding Response Program. Between them they cover the cultural and the scientific efforts to protect the critically endangered Monk Seal from extinction. There are only 1200 monk seals in the world. Most of them in the Northern Archipelago. They breed slowly and are endangered by sharks, human activity in rest areas, fishing line entanglement, and starvation. Don Leutz was happy to be back after a long absence

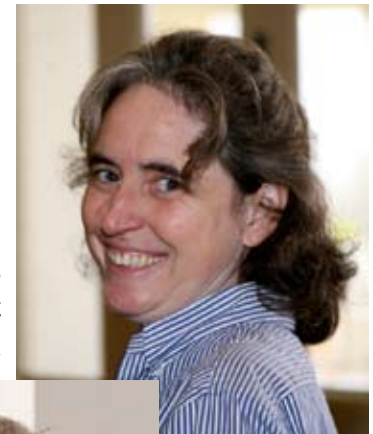


John Oszust said that the quilt his wife Monica made has brought in \$3800 in raffle tickets to end Polio. Raffle drawing is today.


