The University of Hawaii now offers a certificate program in Marine studies. As Kauai grows there have been more opportunities to work in ocean related jobs. Students get hands on experience and learn to apply the scientific method and hone their proposal skills. One of the benefits is a chance to network and find mainland job opportunities. Dr. Stepath said our local reefs are not endangered but could be considered sick. There are no longer big fish in our waters and the reef fish are being depleted by wholesale aquarium dealers. Most of the problems are around populated areas which is no surprise. The good news is that we now have more protected areas and that there is hope that we can solve some of our problems before they get worse.
