Coming Attractions

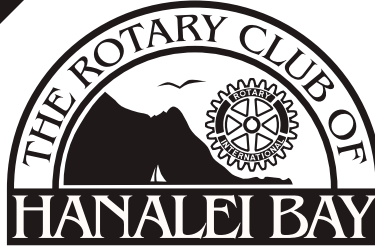
Club Services Chair Tony Motta announced that the club will be having an Estate Sale the first week in April. It's a lot of work but it is a big fund raiser for the club.
