Steven Rymsha talks about KIUC sustainable energy plans



Steven Rymsha is the senior energy solutions engineer for the Kauai Island Utility Cooperative. He ran down the possible ways to create energy to eliminate our dependence on imported oil. Wind is an attractive option and has a proven technology but has a lot of opposition because of our abundance of endangered bird species. Wave power has not been a proven technology. Biomass is feasible and is a part of the overall plan for the future. Solar is expensive but can be cost effective with government subsidies. Hydro-electric is cost effective and is a natural for an island that has as much rainfall as Kauai. Steven said there is a lot of misinformation out in the public right now that will require a lot of open forums and public education to clear up. The projects KIUC is recommending will not require dams or affect water rights. It is a diversion technology that will put the water right back into the stream. In a comment from the audience about why it has taken so long to become energy independent, Steven replied that special interest groups have actively opposed many good projects and that it will require broad base public support to overcome those objections.

Coming Attractions

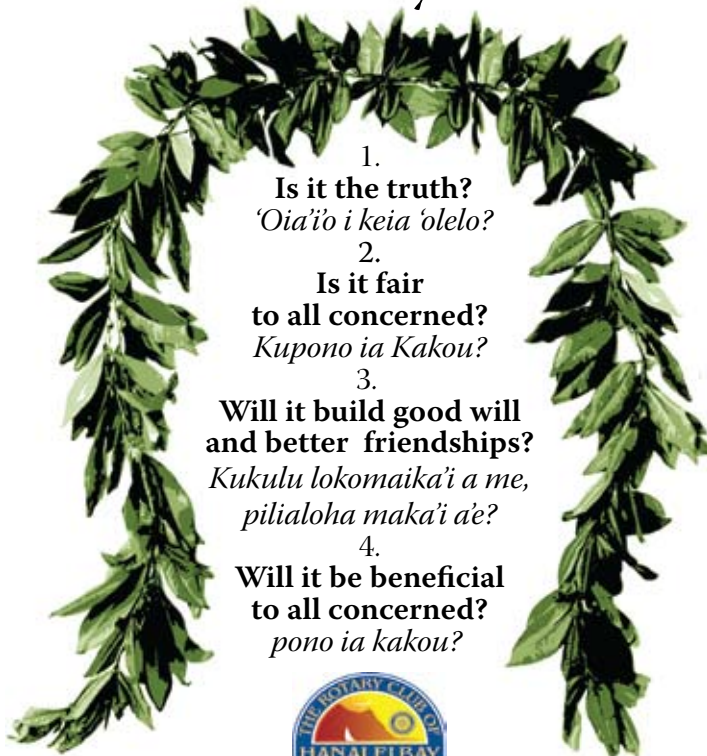
Miniature Golf Tournament, May 23
