Jennifer Luck explains what the Hawaiian Land Trust does

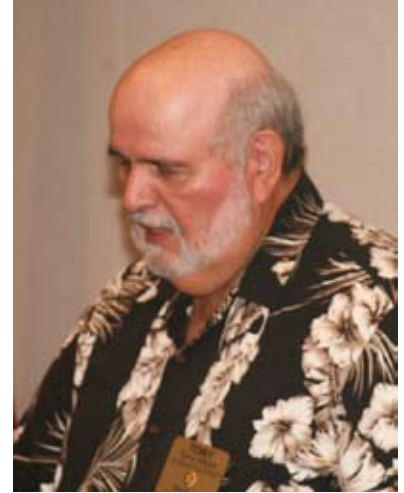


The Hawaiian Land Trust is a nonprofit organization that works with willing land owners to permanently protect property with conservation values such as wildlife habitats, coastal access, scenic views, watersheds, cultural sites and agricultural lands for future generations. Past generations on the island had the luxury of almost unlimited access to most parts of the islands. That is no longer true. Private ownership and development has limited access to many large sections of the islands. The Hawaiian Land Trust provides a way for individuals to donate property and money to protect those resources for the public in perpetuity.

Discounts on Spouse Memberships

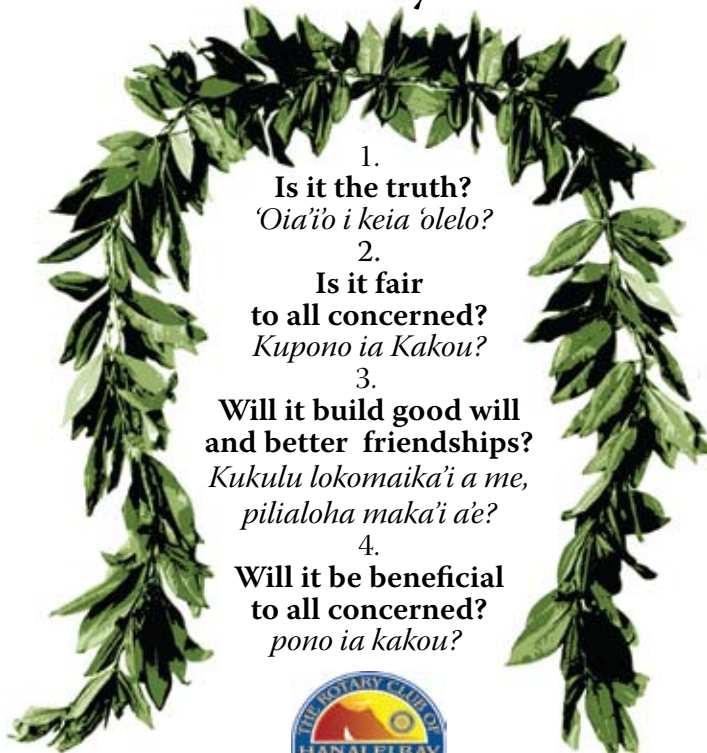
