The Rotary Club of Hanalei Bay receives the RI Significant Achievement Award For “Growing Our own Teachers”



Each Rotary year each District Governor is allowed to submit one nomination for a Community Service project that exemplifies Service Above Self. District Governor George Fontaine received only 6 applications for qualifying projects from the 43 clubs in the State of Hawaii and was allowed to forward only one of these to Rotary International.

The project must stand the test for being adaptable to any club in the World, be one that the Community can participate in, and must be a project that once started, can become a permanent ongoing project. Existing projects that meet these criteria would be Polio Plus, The Wheel Chair Foundation, Cleft Palate Surgery, etc.

Last night at the District 5000 conference, on our Club's behalf club president, Sally Motta received this highest Rotary International honor, The Significant Achievement Award for Growing Our Own Teachers. President Motta applauds each and every member for their contributions to the success of this project. She has always bragged about being President of the best Rotary Club in the World and the club has now raised the bar to its highest level.

Criteria used to judge the entries are as follows. The project must address a significant need in the community. It must involve most or all of the members of the club personally and not just financially. It must be commensurate with the size of the club and the resources available. It must enhance the image of Rotary in the community. It must be something that can be emulated by other Rotary Clubs. It must currently be active or reaching a conclusion during the year the award is given. Congratulations to all for a job well done.

Author Sharon Niederhaus talks about “ Together Again”. A guide for multigenerational living.



Sharon Graham Neiderhaus has written a guide book to help multigenerational families find ways to live together. Her ideas have been used for the basis of magazine articles and she has appeared in an interview on the Today Show. In 2008 there are more than 6 million multigenerational households in the US. At least 18 million 20-34 year-olds live with their parents. With the threat of the failure of Social Security, rising health care costs, failing pension plans and the high cost of Long-term care these numbers are only going to get higher. Rising cost of college and a tough competitive job market are adding to the number of families living together again. In her book she describes many housing options including home remodels. Home remodels for the elderly have requirements many younger people are not aware of such as grab bars in key locations in bathrooms and wheelchair access in all rooms. She also gets to the heart of the matter by getting to critical points to discuss in advance such as an open discussion on financial responsibilities, legal planning, proximity and privacy, and even making cohabitation agreements. A lot of the success in finding common ground is to agree in advance on issues such as the length of stay, childcare, Shared responsibilities, and communications. Sharon said that her biggest compliment was when a reader said that the book was not only a guide but a step-by-step plan to cover potential trouble spots before they became an issue.

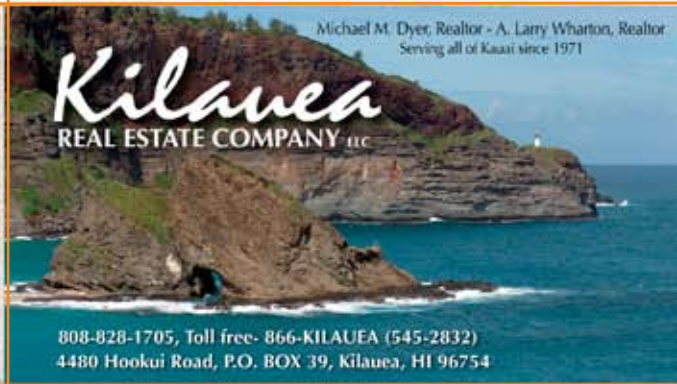
