If you have always had a remote control to your TV and never rode in a car without air conditioning, you probably don't remember much about how polio was the horrible

disease that infected a 1000 lives around the world every day. Jeff Goodman related his experiences growing up with the threat of polio hanging over every kids head.

Suzie Blaylock talked about what it felt like to spend months in an iron lung away from your family and friends. Lou DuBuque explained what it was like to be a parent of a child with polio. They are all experiences that last forever and difficult to talk about even years later.

Jeff Goodman took the opportunity to point out that today there are now only 1000 cases of polio a year in the world instead of 1000 a day. The Rotary International Polio Plus initiative has put the elimination of polio in the world within reach. There are only a few counties that still has the scourge of polio in it's boundary. You can be a part of history by making a contribution to Polio Plus and being a part of the generation that ended polio in the world. 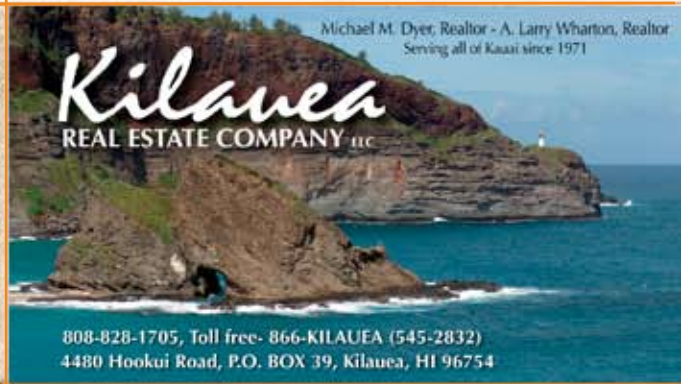
